Easily Adapable

Easy to dig up, divide, and share or keep small. Stays as an upright clump and does not spread far.

Flowers

Upright, slender clusters of white blooms are about 9" long, and flower throughout the summer.

Visitors to Explore

Nectar attracts beneficial pollinators, including honey bees, bumblebees, butterflies and moths.
